

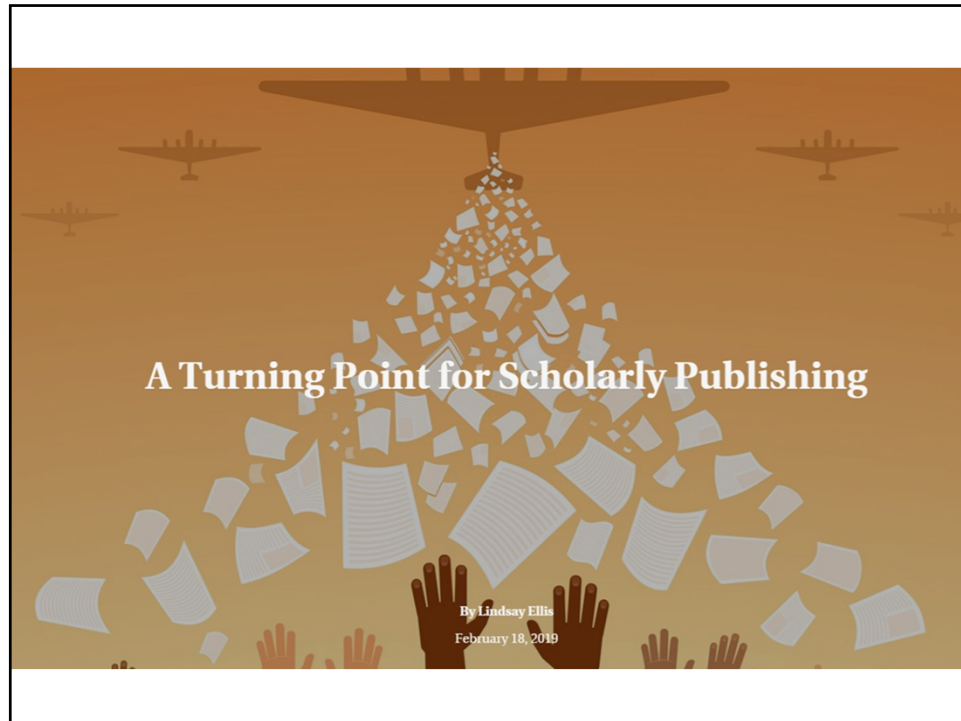

Basic definition of Open Access:

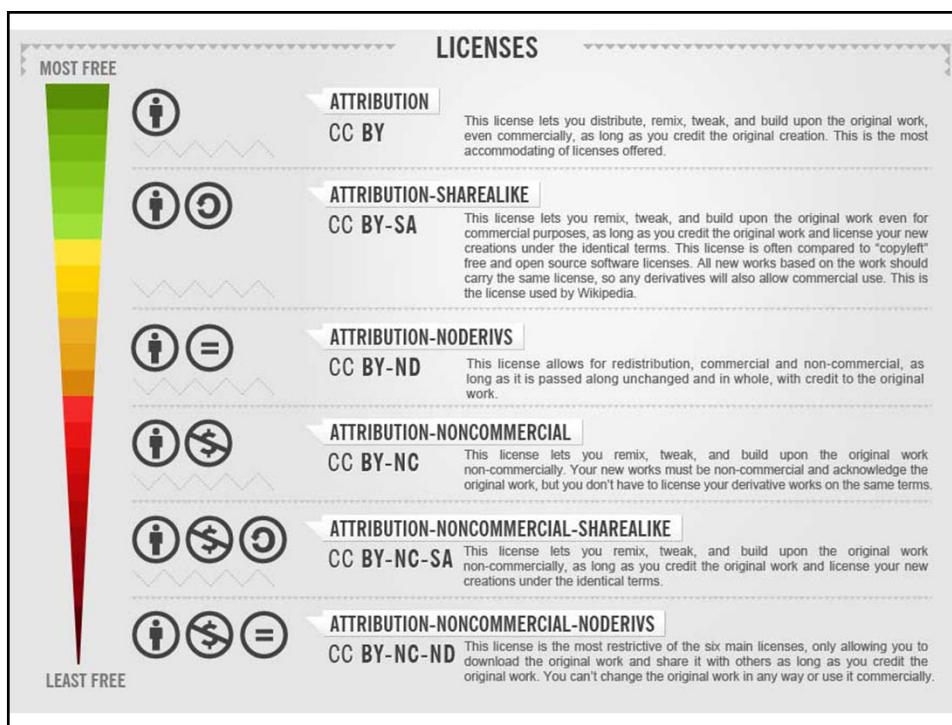
"Open access (OA) literature is digital, online free of charge, and free of most copyright and licensing restrictions," p. 4.

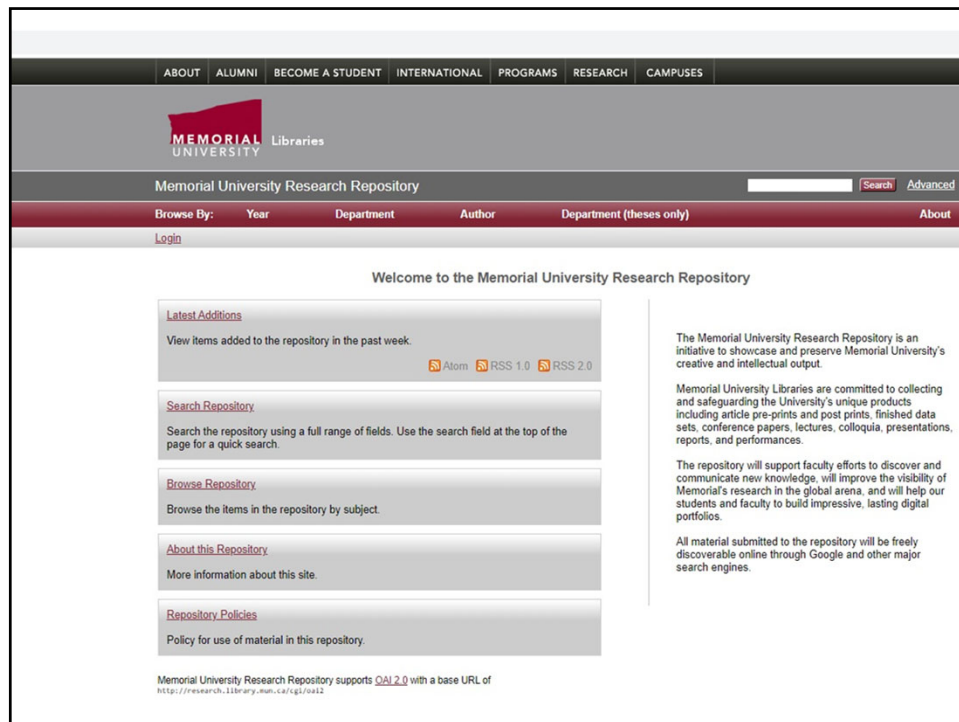

Tri-Agency Policy on Open Access

- CIHR, NSERC, SSHRC
 - Announced on February 27th, 2015
 - Final, peer-reviewed journal articles
 - Implementation Dates
 - May 1, 2015 and onward for NSERC and SSHRC
 - January 1, 2008 and onward for CIHR
 - Freely accessible within 12 months of publication
 - Two Routes
 - Online Repositories (Not Research Gate)
 - Journals

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 **The Singing Network**

The Singing Network was established in October 2014 at Memorial University of Newfoundland (MUN), St. John's, Newfoundland and Labrador, Canada, by Professor Ki Adams and Dr. Andrea Rose along with a steering committee of Memorial University faculty members in music, education and ethnomusicology.

The Singing Network is the starting point for creating and building a MUN-provincial-national-international network of individuals and organizations interested in singing and song: scholars, performing artists, educators, students, as well as professional and community-based musicians organizations and associations. The network generates and produces a series of voice-singing-choral events ranging from workshops, seminars, master-classes, performances, dialogues, the formation of new ensembles, and a biennial international Symposium on Singing and Song.

The projects of The Singing Network are designed to engage individuals and organizations from varied contexts and disciplines. Each of these projects involves collaboration and partnerships with local, national and international colleagues. The international Symposium on Singing and Song, in addition to local, MUN-community based projects, serves to mobilize knowledge, expertise and resources in support of musical, cultural social, health and wellbeing, and educational contexts.

We understand the powerful impact of singing in our communities and aim to stimulate and provide programs and experiences for the sustainable development and innovation of singing and use of the voice in all contexts. The Singing Network is committed to working with multi-disciplinary communities toward the realization of the potential of singing and song in our lives.

The Singing Network is supported by Memorial University School of Music and Faculty of Education, The Bruneau Centre for Excellence in Choral Music, and the MUN Office of Public Engagement.

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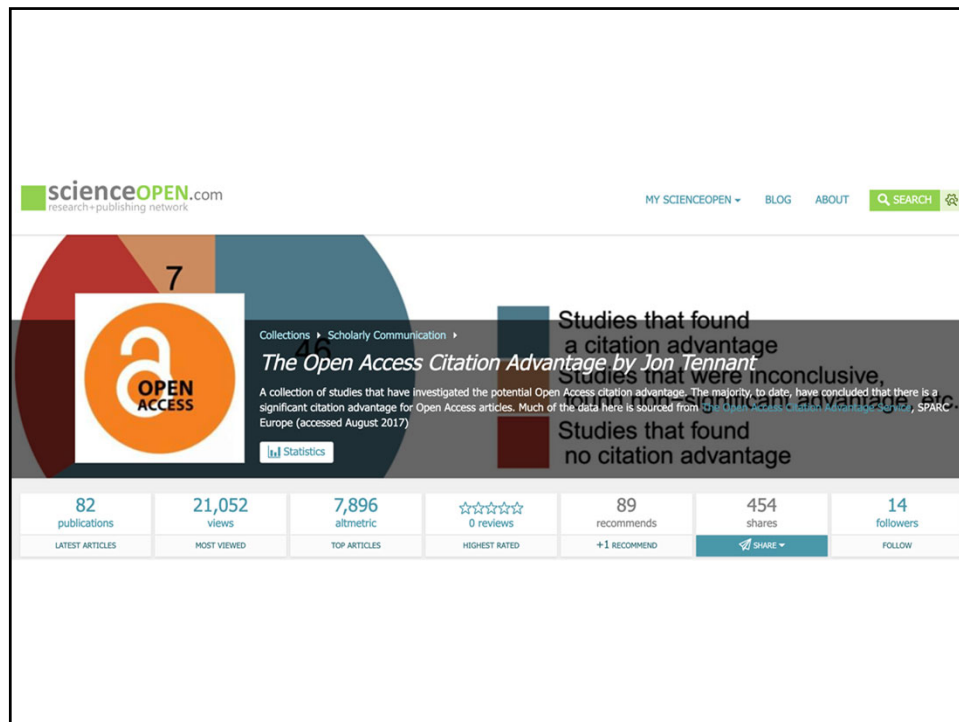

Promotion and Tenure

VCU Faculty Senate Resolution on Open Access Publishing December, 2010

Whereas, the faculty of Virginia Commonwealth University are dedicated to achieving the greatest public good by making their research and scholarship as widely available as possible;

Whereas, commercial publishers of scholarly journals have drastically increased subscription prices to many of the journals where VCU faculty now publish their research and scholarship beyond the affordability of many individuals and institutions; and

Whereas, faculty have many options for publishing their research and scholarship in open access journals, hybrid journals, or in open access repositories so that the world can have free access to it if they negotiate to retain their copyright of their work;

Therefore, the Faculty Senate of Virginia Commonwealth University recommends:

-VCU Promotion and tenure committees should recognize that publication and editorial effort in open access, peer-reviewed journals or re-publication of peer-reviewed articles in an open access repository offers added value and greater public good than scholarship made only available in expensive journal publications.

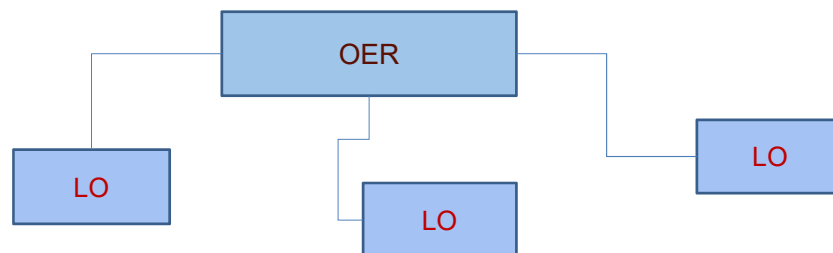
OERs . . .

- are 'materials offered freely and openly to use and adapt for teaching, learning, development and research' ([COL](#))
- open potential for increasing access to education and improving quality while reducing costs ([COL](#))
- allow users to retain reuse, revise, remix and redistribute resources (5R activities) ([Wiley](#))
- include Learning Objects (LOs) ([Wiley](#))

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OER or LO ?

- *Open educational resource*: A learning object that can be freely used, reused, adapted, and shared.

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Why Teach with OERs

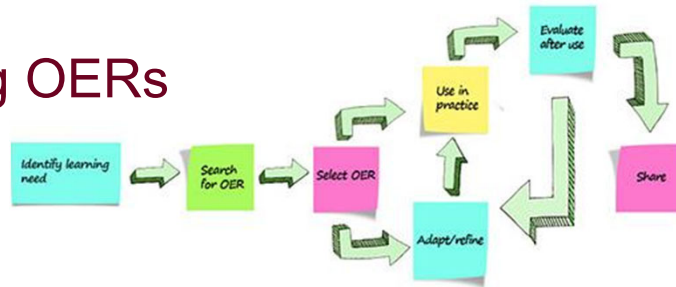
- Variety: texts, activities, media
- Get exact content needed
- Low cost = higher accessibility
- High quality educational experiences save universities money
- Extend use and access to material (pre- and post-course)
- Alternative approaches to knowledge
- Enhance reputation

Selecting OERs



Consider:

- Purpose – outcomes, content, activities, & assessment - *must support learning*
- Select based on reusability, generativity, adaptability, and scalability (Wiley, 2003)
- Granularity – module ↔ image
- Digital rights – creative commons?
- Learning theories – several suitable
